The exhibition will present works by artists Adeline HALOT, Tiffany BOUELLE, Mélinda INFANTE & Meryl YANA.

The material and its evolution are a constant research for the artists, it was therefore essential for them to take possession of the space while being aware of this aspect and adapting to the architecture of the hotel. However, the artists have imposed a single rule on themselves, to arouse the curiosity of the guests by offering them an transforming experience of seeing light.





Our goal is to give you a privileged access by offering you an overview unique behind the scenes of the artist's world and total transparency on their creative process, giving you unique access to the artists.


Through this project, we want to have a real impact by offering artists visibility within our network and financial support through the sale of works of art.

ADELINE HALOT

BORN IN 1992, BRUSSELS



Adeline Halot, is a young Belgian designer seeking to dialogue with materials and textiles which are the very essence of her work. This young artist is behind the development of textile works based on metal threads, which is her favorite material. Throughout these creations, there is a subtle play of transparency and opacity, allowing the light that is anchored

in her work to shine through.

"Without light, there is no matter."

Adeline has developed her own manufacturing processes, adapted to traditional professions. Both innovative and contemporary, the marked identity within her work reveals a dynamism, a need for the artist, and a desire to return to this raw material, which is the thread through a manual and artisanal. By playing with the tension of the thread and its thickness, Adeline creates material effects that stand out from classic weaving weaves.

In a word, Adeline is a creator of space and volume where her works structure and delimit a space through this light which will sublimate the material.

These sculptural pieces, executed by hand, express a desire to translate natural elements - minerals and plants - through weaving. These creations live in an architecture that captures light and expresses a contemplative relationship with time. The combination of natural fibers and metal gives a dynamic result.

Thanks to the use of different threads, the weavings are shaped and the light beams which pass through them give them a kinetic character.

Adeline Halot brings a new dimension to the practice of weaving. Her detailed creations are the result of an instinctive expression that defines the material at the border between art and design.



"I develop a contemporary identity, innovative aspects with manual and artisanal execution. The threads are generally worked before weaving. By playing with the tension of the thread, I create effects and patterns that set me apart from classic weaving patterns. The mineral and aquatic world inspires me."

TIFFANY BOUELLE



A multidisciplinary Franco-Japanese artist, Tiffany Bouelle creates works with abstract shapes and a colorful palette. Intimate and committed, they tell shared moments of life, women's stories, words and ideas that the artist collects from her encounters.


At the heart of her process, there is first writing, guardian of words and thoughts, then drawing which exhausts the subject to reduce it to the essential and finally the line, simple, pure, calligraphed to acrylic or Japanese watercolor.

Her practice, meticulous and choreographed, is similar to a reconquest of the body and the mind, a certain research of harmony.

As a free spirit, Tiffany Bouelle refuses to confine herself to one medium and continues to develop her practice and her technique which she applies equally well to the world of fashion as well as of the one of decorative arts. Expressing herself through different mediums with painting, watercolor, but also textiles and sculpture, the artist allows us to immerse ourselves at the heart of her creative process.

Tiffany's works combine childhood memories inherited from these Japanese roots, nature and women. Indeed, the body and the soul are the two main subjects of the artist's practice, dialoguing between the relationship that women have with their bodies at different moments of their lives.

Fascinated by the discovery of these subjects, Tiffany Bouelle experiments with the invisible links that revolve around our existence and the history of these women through the abstraction of her works. The artist's artistic evolution is marked by this awareness of women within our society and how they perceive themselves. For Tiffany, it is essential to express these points through her work, playing with the boundaries that art might impose on her.



"I think that figuration was a bias that put barriers to my creation. I did a lot of figurative work for years but I gradually realized that abstraction offers you incredible freedom. It's a great outlet when you're a painter and, as far as I'm concerned, almost therapeutic. I saw lots of possibilities.

I like the border between dream and reality that abstraction can offer to people who look at my work. And above all, it allows me to talk about all possible subjects and cross the borders of all countries.

When we evolve in a mixture of origins, we never fully belong to one or the other. It is an omnipresent duality in my painting that I decided to embrace."

MERYL YANA

BORN IN 1996, FRANCE




Meryl Yana is a French artist born in Paris currently based in London. She recently completed an artist residency at JO-HS gallery based in Mexico City and working there towards her solo show. She completed a six months residency at the Museum of Goa. India. where she was invited as a resident artist in the midst of the pandemic. She ended her residency with a solo exhibition: 'Ode From A Grain Of Sand" at the museum. She studied in the Chelsea College of Arts, London where she completed her BA of fine Arts in 2020. She has previously been part of the PADA Residency in Barreiro and the MONO Residency in Lisbon.

Yana's latest pieces are a rearrangement of a set of instinctively chosen elements, inviting the viewer to reflect on the human condition. modernity. ancestral practices. sacred and transgressions themes. Questions about the nature of image making, about what governs inclusion and exclusion, rules and taboos, and sexuality are core themes driving her practice. Yana has used material processes and the principles of the palimpsest to create pieces rooted in the distinctive acts of erasing, hiding and layering that define most archeological finds. She creates works which physical transformation she hoped could contain both past and present, functioning not as record but rather as testaments to the possibilities of time. Indeed, one of the most surprising aspect of Yana's work is how little she can foresee the visual outcome of her experiments. She is guided not so much by an idea of an image but rather by her physical encounter with the laws of chance. As their layered process and aesthetic result remind us of ancient artifacts as well as rock art, this alchemy often results in the works having contemplative and almost sacred tones.



"I am still exploring, driven by curiosity, I am still finding my voice and interests. I like to make mistakes, and then if I like the outcome then I try to figure out how to repeat that mistake over and over again. I do believe there should be some mystery in my work, so I don't want to give too much away. I am always thinking, how can I create art in a world that is already saturated with objects and works, how do you make something new and relevant that doesn't damage the world., I have always been struck by the pleasure which women have to dig deeply into the ground"

MELINDA INFANTES



Melinda Infantes likes to explore different textures and materials, such as clay, ropes and threads, which remind her of vascularity or even different types of skin. At the moment, she mostly uses amate or Japanese paper, chosen for its unique texture obtained from bark. Through this material, she inscribe signs of life and imprints that tell a story and guide her in her creative process.

Melinda begins to work on ficus bark paper, which she transfers and repeats on various supports, thus forming a natural pattern reminiscent of cell division. The works echo the native environment from which the artist draws his inspiration.

She considers her works to be really intimate as she needs to be at her most vulnerable to create and encapsulate her emotions within her works.

During her studies in the medical field, she developed her own artistic style. Melinda Infante considers her art as an extension of her studies: transferring her moments spent in the delivery room onto canvases .The works echo the native environment from which the artist draws his inspiration.

Thus was born her proposal, her series of works which she calls "be a drop" - to be a drop, the abyss of a drop which multiplies until forming the magic of the human. Melinda begins to show her work in her workshop but through networks she manages to reach a large national and international audience.



"My interest in the textures and materials of papers was aroused by their resemblance to human bodies, particularly through my medical studies as a midwife. This passion for life is the driving force behind my art, which for me is a natural continuation of this interest."






